#### I. NATURE OF ITEM

Second Public Hearing Presentation on Review of Draft Maps and Transition to District-Based Elections Process

#### II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On August 20, 2018, the Board adopted Resolution No.18-637 declaring their intent to transition from at-large elections to district-based elections in accordance with the California Voting Rights Act (CVRA) for the November 2022 General Election, following the completion and receipt of the data from the 2020 Census. On July 6, 2020 the Board approved an agreement with Lapkoff and Gobalet for demographic services to assist in creating the new voting district maps pursuant to the CVRA.

A number of outreach activities must take place before the new voting district maps can be finalized. These activities include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Conducting public outreach, including to non-English-speaking communities to explain the districting process and to encourage public participation.
- 2. Holding two public hearings to gather input before draft voting district maps are prepared.
- 3. Holding two additional public hearings after draft voting district maps have been prepared for additional public feedback.
- 4. Publicizing the above public hearings in advance (on website, social media, in press releases, posted in community).
- 5. Holding a public meeting on the proposed voting district maps for approval.
- 6. Submitting the approved final version of voting district maps to the County's Office of Elections.

Today's meeting is the fourth of five public hearings. The public has been invited to join in person and virtually. The fifth public hearing to review Board's preferred draft map will take place on Monday, April 4, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. at the District's Boardroom. An interpreter is available to assist with anyone desiring Spanish-language interpretation virtually via Zoom.

#### III. COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

At the last hearing, the Board directed staff to have the demographers create revised draft maps that keep the existing board members in separate voting districts and meet all the other state and federal map requirements. They also requested that the revised draft maps clearly show the major roadways and proposed boundaries. The revised maps were also to display Latinx population in each draft district in a shading.

Shelley Lapkoff, of Lapkoff and Gobalet Demographers, will give an updated presentation on the process, review the revised draft maps, and take any questions the Board or public may have. This presentation and any comments or questions will be recorded in both English and Spanish for future viewing on the District's website.

As this item is for informational purposes, no action is required.

#### I. NATURE OF ITEM

Consideration of LAFCO Municipal Services Review Questionnaire

#### II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The District's sphere of influence is reviewed and updated every 5 years by the Santa Barbara Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO). This is accomplished through the preparation of a document called a Municipal Service Review (MSR). LAFCO has initiated the MSR process for 33 separate agencies and has issued a survey questionnaire to gather the information required to prepare the draft MSR.

Attached to this report is a copy of the survey response request letter from LAFCO dated February 9, 2022. The response to the survey is due March 31, 2022. While much of the information being requested about the District doesn't require Board direction, the one question that does is whether the District desires any changes to its sphere of influence.

The District's current sphere of influence boundary is mostly coterminous with its jurisdictional boundary. Modification to the District's sphere of influence has been discussed during prior MSR updates but no changes have been made. While the District may request consideration of a change in its sphere of influence boundary, any change is subject to review and approval by LAFCO.

According to the California Association of Local Agency Formation Commissions (CALAFCO) an agencies sphere of influence is defined as:

A planning boundary outside of an agency's legal boundary (such as the city limit line) that designates the agency's probable future boundary and service area. Factors considered in a sphere of influence review focus on the current and future land use, the current and future need and capacity for service, and any relevant communities of interest.

The purpose of the sphere of influence is to ensure the provision of efficient services while discouraging urban sprawl and the premature conversion of agricultural and open space lands by preventing overlapping jurisdictions and duplication of services.

A copy of the draft response to the MSR survey questionnaire along with a map showing the District's current jurisdictional boundary and sphere of influence boundary are included as reference materials.

#### III. COMMENTS

Staff is seeking the Board direction on whether any changes to the District's sphere of influence is desired. If so, staff will include this information in the response to the MSR survey questionnaire. The responses to the survey will form the basis for the draft MSR that is scheduled to be available for review in September 2022.



#### I. NATURE OF ITEM

Status Update on Usage of Employee Assistance Program

#### II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The District's employees are its most valuable asset and are critical to delivering excellent service. As such, the District offers a robust employee benefits program that includes a full suite of healthcare coverage, a service-based retirement system, life insurance, pretax health spending accounts, access to additional retirement and investment accounts, health and wellness programs, and employee performance recognition programs. This list of benefits has evolved over time. In September 2022 the District's employee benefits program was expanded to include an Employee Assistance Program (EAP).

Employee Assistance Programs (EAPs) began as occupational counselling programs offering treatment for work performance impairment problems such as alcohol and drug use, but have evolved to include items such as financial counseling, stress management, critical incident response, legal counseling, identity theft, smoking cessation, and a number of mental health issues. Adoption of an EAP was included in the District's 2020 Strategic Plan and 2020 Annual Action Plan.

On September 21, 2020 the Governing Board approved an annual service contract with Claremont EAP for \$4500. The EAP program was introduced to staff in November of 2020.

One of the deliverables of the Claremont EAP is an Annual Utilization Report. According to the agency representative, the District's usage was 17.1%. This percentage is higher than the national average usage of between 4-6%. This percentage is found by dividing the total number of Clinical and Life Management cases by the total number of employees, in our case 6 divided by 35 to equal 17.1%. All of the cases were self-referrals for the employees themselves (not family members) and 75% of those who contacted Claremont were very satisfied with the initial call; 73% were very satisfied with the EAP counselor. This leaves some room for improvement. 98% would recommend the EAP to a friend or colleague.

#### III. COMMENTS

A copy of the Annual Utilization Report is included in this item. The staff seem to be well-aware of the opportunity to access the EAP, and it is required as part of

the contract that staff be given a packet with contact information, an Evidence of Coverage and Disclosure form, and information on the Employee Assistance Program annually.

All information shared in the Annual Utilization Report is anonymous, employees' privacy is always protected and no members of management are aware of contact with Claremont unless the employee chooses to share this information.

Information about the program is also included on the District's intranet portal for ease of access.

As this item is for information only, no action is required at this time.






### Was Initial Appointment with the EAP scheduled in a timely fashion?





### Self-Reported Helpfulness of EAP in Resolving Issue




#### **Provider Reported Rating of Client Improvement**

#### II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Sielinde Pukke, agent for the owners of 1351 Holiday Hill Road, has requested a Sewer Service Availability letter. The SSA was issued on August 14, 2020. The property is outside the District's Sphere of Influence (SOI). The property contains a 24,000 SF commercial art studio. The owners propose to connect to the existing private sewer force main owned by the Santa Barbara Wildlife Care Network (WCN) located on N. Fairview Avenue in order to serve the property. District staff has been informed that the owners of the Holiday Hill property will enter into agreement with WCN to allow the connection of the proposed new sewer line.

Staff received a letter from LAFCO dated January 14, 2022 requesting District review of the proposed annexation. A copy of the letter is attached to this report and is presented herein for Board consideration.

#### III. COMMENTS

It is the District's understanding that Ms. Pukke and Ms. Trish Allen of Suzanne Elledge Permitting and Planning Services are preparing the LAFCO submittals required for the annexation of the property. District staff has been in communication with Ms. Pukke and Ms. Allen.

Staff has reviewed the proposal and has issued an SSA with standard conditions. As such staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to inform LAFCO that the District doesn't object to the proposed annexation.





This letter is in response to your recent inquiry relative to the availability of sewer service for the above-mentioned property.

The subject property, as shown on the attached parcel map, is currently outside the Goleta Sanitary District service area (sphere of influence) and is not annexed to the District. Based on the District's preliminary understanding from the information you provided, your client proposes to construct a private sewer lift station and force main to be connected to the existing Wildlife Care Network force main in order to provide sewer service for the property. Currently the non-profit Clay Studio occupies an existing 24,000 SF building which is served by a septic system.

Please be advised that adequate sewage collection, treatment, and disposal capacity is currently available to serve the proposed project and that the District does not currently have a moratorium or similar restriction on new sewer connections. Subject to the terms specified in this letter, and upon satisfaction of the conditions set forth in the attached Exhibit "A", the District will issue a sewer connection permit and authorize the connection of the project to the District's sewer collection system. Although adequate sewer capacity is currently available to serve the project, issuing this letter does not guarantee sewer service by the District or reserve capacity for the project. The District provides all new sewer service on a first-come, first-serve basis, as determined from the date on which the connection permit is issued. The District cannot predict the pace of future development in the community and cannot anticipate the demand for new sewer service.

Upon completion of the SOI and annexation, the applicant/owner(s) must submit a complete copy of the final building structure site, floor and plumbing plans to the District. The District will review the plans and contact the applicant and the Oounty of Santa Barbara after plans are reviewed. The County of Santa Barbara Building and Safety, Public Works Road Division and Environmental Health may require that you apply for additional permits.

Applicant to submit engineered plans for connection of proposed sewer force main to existing WildLife Care Network sewer force main for District review.

In the event it is necessary to construct a sewer main or trunk line extension and/or appurtenances thereto (the "Extension") to connect the project to the District's existing sewer collection system, the Extension shall be constructed, and any necessary easements shall be obtained, by and at the expense of the applicant. Upon completion of the Extension and the connection of the Project to the District's sewer system, the applicant shall execute and deliver to the District a Grant of Rights document in recordable form conveying the Extension to the District. The applicant shall also convey to the District any easements necessary to enable the District to properly operate, repair and maintain the Extension. This easement document must be executed, complete and ready for recordation. Enclosed is a copy of the District's General and Construction Notes which are to be included on the improvement plans.

Easements must be a minimum 15 feet wide and vehicle access easement must be a minimum 12 feet wide. Easement widths are based on the size and depths of the sewerlines. No trees or shrubbery may be planted within the GSD easement.

A sampling manhole, per District Standards, if required after our review of the project plans, needs to be shown on the plans and constructed and installed at the property line or within the private property.

A grease interceptor, if required after review of the project plans, needs to be shown on the plans and installed outside the building within the private property.

Building structures on the lot, not directly connected to a public sewer, will have to be separately connected with the public sewer upon subsequent subdivision of the lot.

Each property has to be separately connected to District facilities.

If there is an inability to achieve gravity flow from the building structure to the District's sewage collection facilities, an injector pump system design will need to be submitted to the Santa Barbara County Building and Safety Division for approval prior to connection of any portion of your force main sewer system. The design must include dual pump and alarm system.

A backflow preventer encased in a concrete vault with a metal lid, embossed with "sewer" or "clean-out", must be installed within the private property whenever the residential interior plumbing fixtures are lower than the District's upstream manhole rim elevation. This manhole is the next immediate manhole upstream from the structure sewer service connection to the main sewerline.

In cases where well treatment facilities are to be connected to the District's facilities the applicant needs to submit a discharge analysis report and quantity of the discharge in gallons per year for the purpose of calculating connection fees.

All well treatment facilities, commercial and industrial manufacturing establishments are subject to the District's Industrial Waste Control Pretreatment requirements. An Industrial Waste Control Permit Application must be submitted prior to issuance of the service permit.

The Applicant shall provide the District with verification that a private and/or public sewer easement has been created, conveyed and recorded, thus allowing the connection of the project to the District's public sewer. The easement documentation shall include language expressly providing for: <u>"The construction, installation, repair, operation and maintenance of the building and lateral sewer,"</u> which connect the project to the District's public sewer.

The Applicant shall provide the District with verification that an agreement to share the existing Wild Life Care Network private sewer force main has been created, conveyed and recorded. In the event that an assessment district is formed for the purpose of providing sewer service for the Holiday Hill area, any agreement to share the existing Wild Life Care Network private sewer force main shall be subservient to the terms and conditions of the sewer assessment district.

Once the plans and easement documents have been received, reviewed and accepted, the District will stamp the plans approved. A sewer connection permit may be obtained by the applicant once they have paid all applicable fees, posted all required bonds and satisfied all applicable ordinances, regulations, standards and requirements of the District and any other local, state or federal agency with jurisdiction over the project.

Under no circumstance shall the fee be less than that of a single family dwelling.



# I. NATURE OF ITEM

Consideration of Resolution No. 22-679, Repealing Resolution No. 18-624 Authorizing Investment of District Money in Local Agency Investment Fund and Resolution No. 22-680 Repealing Resolution No. 21-661 Designating Persons Authorized to Act on District Accounts.

# II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The annual change rotation of Board President and President Pro Tem requires new signature cards for the District's accounts. In reviewing the new signature cards, Community West Bank's auditors raised concerns that the District's authorizing resolutions don't specifically reference all current bank accounts or otherwise reflect the District's banking practice with respect to the signature and transfer authority of the smaller ancillary accounts.

In reviewing the prior authorizing Resolutions, legal counsel has determined that two separate resolutions needed revisions. These are Resolution No. 18-624 and Resolution No. 21-661.

Revisions to the Local Agency Investment Fund Resolution No. 18-624 are proposed to better reflect the activity in that account, including the authority to make deposits and transfer funds to other District Accounts. Proposed Resolution No 22-679 (attached) repeals Resolution No. 18-632 in its entirety and includes these changes.

Resolution No. 21-661 (attached) designates the following individuals as authorized signatories on all the District's bank accounts:

Governing Board President Governing Board President Pro Tem General Manager Plant Operations Manager

However, two smaller ancillary accounts, the Petty Cash and an Accounts Receivable ACH Zero Balance account are held at Community West Bank. These accounts require signature and transfer authority that is different from the larger accounts included in Resolution No. 21-661. The proposed Resolution No. 22-680 (attached) repeals Resolution No. 21-661 in its entirety and includes the above changes, and designates authority for signing, transfers and approval of Payroll Direct Deposit transactions.

# III. COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Staff recommends the Board approve and adopt the proposed Resolutions No. 22-679 and No. 22-680 to clarify the authorized activities and signers on the District's accounts.





## GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

#### GOLETA SANITARY DISTRICT GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The following summary report describes the District's activities from March 8, 2022 through March 21, 2022. It provides updated information on significant activities under three major categories: Collection System, Treatment/Reclamation and Disposal Facilities, and General and Administration Items.

#### 1. COLLECTION SYSTEM REPORT

#### LINES CLEANING

Staff is conducting routine lines cleaning in the area of Hollister Avenue and Nogal Drive.

#### **CCTV INSPECTION**

Staff continues routine Closed-Circuit Television (CCTV) inspections in the area of Hollister Avenue and Modoc Road.

#### **GREASE AND OIL INSPECTIONS**

Staff continues with the annual Grease and Oil inspections.

#### **REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE**

Staff continues working with City of Goleta on their current paving project on Hollister and S. Kellogg Avenues. A total of five (5) District manholes will be raised to grade by the City's contractor as part of the paving project which is anticipated to be completed by the end of March 2022.

#### **GOLETA SANITARY DISTRICT FY 2021-22 PILOT PROJECTS**

Tierra Contracting has completed the work of replacing the manhole covers and frames on Calle Real near El Sueno Road. A total of 17 frames were replaced. The sewer lateral connection repair work was started on Tuesday, March 15, 2022 and completed on Wednesday, March 16, 2022. Five lateral connection Cured In Place Pipe (CIPP) repairs were installed. The Armorock manhole installation and the fiberglass manhole liner installation are scheduled to be completed in the coming weeks as materials are delivered to the respective contractors.

#### 2021 CCTVI PROJECT REVIEW & ASSET MANAGEMENT PROGRAM UPDATE

Staff has finalized review of the Asset Management Plan with Hazen & Sawyer. The updated files and information will be uploaded to the District's Capital Improvement Program story map.

#### 2. TREATMENT, RECLAMATION AND DISPOSAL FACILITIES REPORT

Plant flows have increased to an average of 4.7 million gallons per day (MGD) with UCSB returning to full in-person instruction, bringing plant flows back to near pre-pandemic levels. The demand for reclaimed water has begun to increase due to warmer temperatures. Flow concentrations and loadings during the weekends continue to cause intermittent challenges and various levels of plant interference. The Reclamation Disinfection Study by Hazen and Sawyer (Hazen) has completed the initial data collection and analysis. Conclusions to date demonstrate that there is a strong correlation between high total coliform values and surfactant concentrations. The next steps involve designing

bench testing protocols to evaluate some of the proposed short-term solutions such as: peracetic/performic acid augmentation and enhanced coagulation/flocculation. Medium and long-term solutions such as micro/nano-filtration and ultraviolet disinfection prior to chlorination will be evaluated at a feasibility level for cost and constructability.

Biofilter #2 has been modified to run as a mixed reactor, having both an aerobic (with oxygen) process and a submerged anaerobic (without oxygen) process. This modification will reduce the biological loading on the activated sludge process and hopefully will reduce the inhibitory impact of cleaning chemicals entering the plant. Currently, we are seeing nitrogen removal across the biofilter of about 60% which corresponds to about 12.5% of the total treatment plant's nitrogen removal. This reduction of nutrient loading on the downstream processes has already provided a new level of overall process stability.

Centrifuge and dredging operations continue in lagoon #2.

The Lystek Thickened Waste Activated Sludge (TWAS) pre-treatment pilot project has been configured and tested. New larger hoses have been installed. We have successfully run the reactor at double the solids concentration from our initial testing. We have verified that our propane use has dropped proportionately. Instrumentation changes have been made and the reactor is now operating 24 hours a day. When the reactor is running consistently, we are seeing a significant increase in biogas production. We hypothesize that the thermal alkaline hydrolysis process may be destroying inhibitory chemicals that have adsorbed onto the sludge. We will be testing this hypothesis by sampling for these chemicals before and after the reactor once a steady state during the demonstration period has been reached. Once the demonstration period is complete, a summary report of the results and proforma analysis will be prepared and brought to the Board.

The Influent Pump Station Rehabilitation project has begun with the submittal and procurement process for the long lead-time items. Construction of the project may not start for another 6-9 months depending on the completion of the procurement process.

A workshop on the environmental document for Biosolids and Energy Strategic Plan (BESP) Phase 1 is scheduled for later this month. This project is scheduled to begin construction by the end of the calendar year and be completed by the end of 2023.

BESP Phases 2 & 3 preliminary engineering design is continuing to move forward. This project will provide a 30% design package for a centrifuge, thermal dryer, and a fats, oil and grease (FOG) receiving facility. This level of design is necessary to understand the cost and funding implications of the project.

#### PUBLIC EDUCATION AND OUTREACH

Outreach and publication of information continues for the District's public hearings on voting district draft maps for the transition to district-based elections. Radio, digital, print, and social media advertisements continue, and the printed flyer prompted two phone calls

from members of the public. The District's website has been updated with new versions of the draft voting district maps. Public notice was placed in the Santa Barbara News Press on Monday, March 14, 2022 for the next hearing on March 21, 2022 at the District's headquarters and remotely. Nearly all outreach was done in both English and Spanish.


