Tours

The Goleta Sanitary District offers facility tours to adults and children ages 7+. Tours highlight how we clean wastewater, which mimics nature's treatment processes. If you are interested in a tour, please contact Laura Romano DeFazio at Iromano@goletasanitary.org or call 805-967-4519 x.128. Tours are generally scheduled on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday between 9am-3pm, with a minimum of five and a maximum of 25 individuals required. Tours take appx 90 minutes.



The District is in the process of reviewing our future plans for biosolids disposal, diversification, and energy sustainability. In an effort to maximize the reclamation and use of resources, we are working with contractor Hazen and Sawyer to determine the best steps forward with a Biosolids and Energy Strategic Plan (BESP). Some options include creating liquid fertilizer for landscape and agricultural use, pelletizing of solids for similar applications, and high strength food waste energy generation. Goleta Sanitary District's goal is to achieve long-term energy neutrality.

GSD Lab and Operating Staff make a splash with Water Science Program for SB United Way's FITS students

144 students at three locations participated in the inaugural Water Science program given by the staff from GSD's lab and operations departments.

The students participated in experiments to measure pH, biological oxygen demand, and to test for microorganisms in wastewater. The students are enrolled in the Santa Barbara County United Way's Fun in the Sun (FITS) summer learning program for disadvantaged youth. 48 students at each of the

three sites enjoyed learning about water and getting hands on experience in STEM activities. One student wrote, "Thank you so much for your time and to teach us things that we did not know." The participating locations included El Camino Elementary in Goleta, Franklin Elementary, and Harding Elementary in Santa Barbara.

It's our hope that we can offer this program to local Goleta Union School District sites.

UCSB Food Waste to Energy Demonstration Project

The District is partnering with UCSB and Canadian company Lystek International in an EPIC (Electric Program Investment Charge) grant awarded through the California Energy Commission. The District's partnership with UCSB uses their food waste to aid in the processing of biosolids to create additional biogas and energy. Lystek International is a leader in biosolids and organics management, based in Ontario, Canada. The project testing begins in August 2019 and runs through January 2020. This partnership demonstrates Goleta Sanitary District's commitment to recapture resources and protect the environment through innovation and technology.



Demo Garden

The Water Resource Recovery Facility is proud to feature a demonstration garden as part of our educational tours. The garden features six citrus trees, in a nod to Goleta's rich agricultural heritage; and demonstrates how we recover and reuse resources captured in the process of wastewater purification. The Demonstration garden is

planted with the addition of biosolids made in house, and is watered by drip irrigation using the recycled water made here. We are also planting vegetables-which thrive in the nutrient-rich soil amended with our biosolids. If you can't make a tour, come by and see the garden at our October 12th Open House.
